At 8:25 Lanny continued with turning a natural edge bowl. He did a fine job of discussing each tool before cutting chips. The demo ended at 8:38 PM.


Lanny hosted the Show and tell table until 8:44 PM—meeting adjourned.

The shop is really crowded with tools but no doubt we can manage.


